

About The Literacy Project



The Literacy Project currently provides the following programs:

English for Speakers of Other
Languages (ESL or ESOL) or Adult
Literacy Program The Adult Literacy
Program serves over 200 adults per year
with one-on-one tutoring services.

Raising A Reader Preschool children receive bright red book bags that are rotated into the homes of low-income families on a weekly basis.

Study Friends A middle-school tutoring program that matches students with adult volunteer tutors.

Reading Buddies Program Matches high school and elementary school students to support literacy at both levels.

Serving 600 individuals and families living in Eagle County.

Need for Funding

The Literacy Project of Eagle County (TLP) is a non-profit organization based in Avon, Colorado that provides free tutoring to adults and children via volunteer tutors. The organization was founded and received its nonprofit designation in 1990 after an Eagle County School District task force identified parental illiteracy as a barrier to children's educational progress, especially in cases in which parents were unable to help their children with homework assignments. TLP served 20 individuals that first year, a number that has grown exponentially as the population of limited English speakers has grown in Eagle County.
